How is prayer an encouragement? So much of life is beyond our control. Prayer reaches out to the One who has control and seeks His will for our discouraging world. Confession time - How often do we say we will pray for someone and then never take the time to do so? Yes, we are supposed to pray continually, but I mean stopping what we are doing and praying for someone. I've caught myself saying I would pray for someone only to realize later that I never really did. I can't tell you how many times I have heard someone going through a very hard time say they "felt" the prayers of others. It was an encouragement.

Hope in Jesus

The best encouragement that we have is that we are saved by grace through the death and resurrection of Jesus. It's no surprise, Paul said the same thing to the Thessalonians.
