

Jesus Set His Face

When the days drew near for him to be taken up, he set his face to go to Jerusalem. And he sent messengers ahead of him, who went and entered a village of the Samaritans, to make preparations for him. But the people did not receive him, because his face was set toward Jerusalem. (Luke 9:51-53)

When God turns His face toward something, that means good things. It means that He sees what His face is toward. It means He remembers what His face is toward, and when God remembers things, He does something about them.

When Jesus set His face toward Jerusalem, that meant really good things. It meant that He had a singular focus; a focus on the cross. He knew where He was supposed to go and what would happen to Him. As He says, "Thus it is written, that the Christ should suffer and on the third day rise from the dead, and that repentance for the forgiveness of sins should be proclaimed in his name to all nations." It means that just as Jesus turned and faced Jerusalem, He turned to you in your baptism, and by that work on the cross shows that He does things for you. He remembers you. He cares for you and blesses you with that work, and He promises this in all things. No matter what else you see, you can know this promise He makes to you.
