

### NICENE CREED


### LCMS COMMUNION STATEMENT





## 2025 Convention Report: Wellness



we have made wellness a priority with the goal of caring wholistically for church workers, realizing that healthy church workers are a key component to healthy ministry.

We are grateful for partners who hold this value and work toward wellness for church workers. In the past triennium, the NID President's Office has conducted periodic "check-ins" with pastors via zoom to provide for their spiritual care and to keep them supported in their ministry. Through NID's Partnership Grant, we were blessed to partner with Circuit W-8 which conducted a wellness retreat at Walcamp in 2023. The retreat presenter, Brenda Jank from "Run Hard Rest Well," focused on the value and practices of relaxation and "de-stressing." In 2024, the NID again assisted in sponsoring this retreat which grew in number and scope, as Circuit W-8 invited Circuit N-3 to participate. 2024's retreat presenter was Grace Place's Dr. Bev Yahnke, who brought a focus on the biblical perspective of sabbath rest.

The NID has faithfully responded to church workers through Soldiers and Veterans of the Cross, which are grants available through Synod to help offset financial burdens. These applications usually bring a benefit of \$2500 (split 50/50 between Synod and District). We thank God for the ability to help the Lord's servants this way in their time of need!

The Church Worker Care Team has been active throughout the triennium. This team is comprised of three pastors, one DCE, and one CUC professor, the Care Team Director, Dr. Debbie Arfsten. The team comes alongside church workers for a short period of time to provide spiritual care and basic Christian coaching. The team is ready to address both the professional and personal concerns of church workers and and have the resources to make psychological referrals for those All five Church Worker Care Team members, on average, have received 2 to 6 contacts a month from church workers seeking their support. The pastors on this team also attend one of the regional pastoral conferences each year, providing care and support at those events. The Church Worker Care Team would like to expand by adding at least one teacher.

The NID Wellness Committee has met several times to explore what the pursuit of wellness looks like on a congregational level and how best to support our ministries as they pursue worker wellness. As the committee analyzed next steps in their work, they developed a working model for wellness that could be implemented by a part-time NID staff person who would head up wellness initiatives in the District. We have developed a job description for such a position with plans to bring on a part-time Wellness Officer in 2025.

**WHEREAS,** our Lord Jesus Christ instituted His Supper for the forgiveness of sins, refreshment, comfort and strength (Matthew 26:26-29; Mark 14:22-25; Luke 22:15 20; 1 Corinthians 11:23-26; LC V 72); and

**WHEREAS,** our Lord was physically present with His disciples at His institution of His Supper and personally administered the elements to them, and likewise He calls His undershepherds, namely the men whom He called to the Office of the Public Ministry, to administer His supper in person to His people (John 19 20:22-23; AC V; AC VII; AC XXIV 30); and

**WHEREAS,** we must therefore, "never think of the Sacrament as something harmful from which we had better flee, but as a pure, wholesome, comforting remedy that grants salvation and comfort" (LC V 68); and

**WHEREAS,** we are commanded by God to gather to receive God's Word and Sacrament (SC Third Commandment) and "not neglect meeting together" (Hebrews 10:25), and

 **WHEREAS,** historically the Church has thus recognized herself as essential during times of plague (notable examples including the plague of Alexandria in 250 AD, where the Christians who remained to tend for the sick were considered martyrs, and the 1527 plague at Wittenberg, where Martin Luther recommends in his letter that some in the pastoral office must remain to serve the sick and dying); and

**WHEREAS,** historically, even in times of plague, pastors have brought Absolution, God's Word, and Sacrament to the sick and shut-ins when they were unable to be present at church and were near death; and

**WHEREAS,** during the recent Covid pandemic and due to concerns of disease spread and lack of personal protection equipment, pastors and churches were forbidden to visit those who were hospitalized and in long-term residential care facilities; and

**WHEREAS**, we are to be subject to the governing authorities (Romans 13:1), yet where the authorities contradict God's Word, we are to obey Him rather than men (Acts 5:29); and

WHEREAS, the 2023 Convention of the Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod (LCMS)



affirmed in-person communion (Resolution 5-08A) and encouraged in-person worship (Resolution 4-06) and directed the Commission on Theology and Church Relations (CTCR) to "produce a study of the Third Commandment that addresses...its application to Christian worship today";

Therefore be it

**RESOLVED,** that the Northern Illinois District urge that where a man ordained to the Office of the Public Ministry is present and available, congregations should continue the in-person administration of the Lord's Supper, even during times of plague; and be it further

**RESOLVED,** that the Northern Illinois District urge congregations, using God's gifts of science and reason, to take steps to lessen fear and risk, while not interfering with the administration of the Lord's Supper as He instituted it; and be it further

**RESOLVED,** that the Northern Illinois District affirm that the bringing of Word and Sacrament to the sick and shut-in is essential to his/her well-being, and the pastor, as a physician of souls, should have the same visiting rights and responsibilities as for the health care worker; and be it further

 **RESOLVED,** that the Northern Illinois District affirm that, in Christian freedom (Galatians 5:1) and based on local realities, some congregations may choose to temporarily and briefly suspend public gatherings during times of plague, but that the deliverance of Word and Sacrament must continue; and be it further

15	WHEREAS, As a condition of acquiring and holding membership in the Synod, as
16	stated in Const. Art. VI 3 of the Constitution of the Synod, every congregation and
17	minister must agree to observe and respect the individual congregation's right to
18	call a pastor and not interfere with that pastor's proper authority in matters
19	pertaining to his call, and
20	
21	WHEREAS, C.F.W. Walther's Kirche und Amt, adopted by the LCMS in Convention as
22	official doctrine (2001 Synod Convention To Affirm Synod's Official Position on Church
23	and Ministry RESOLUTION 7-17A), further defends the aforementioned rights and is
24	explicitly clear that pastors are not to meddle in congregations to which they have
25	no call or responsibility for ecclesiastical oversight according to the good order of
26	the church;

28	Therefore be it,
29	
30	<b>RESOLVED,</b> That the NID memorialize the Synod in its 2026 convention to reaffirm
31	these beliefs, and be it finally
32	
33	<b>RESOLVED,</b> That ecclesiastical supervisors fraternally, yet strongly, rebuke any
34	pastors (retired, called elsewhere, etc.) interfering with the internal affairs of a
35	congregation to which they are not properly called to preserve the unity of the church's
36	witness.
